We are accepting donations up to Thursday 24th October and will then arrange delivery to the S6 Foodbank.



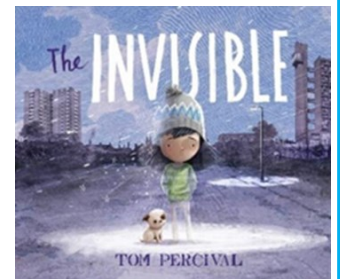

KS2 Tuck Shop

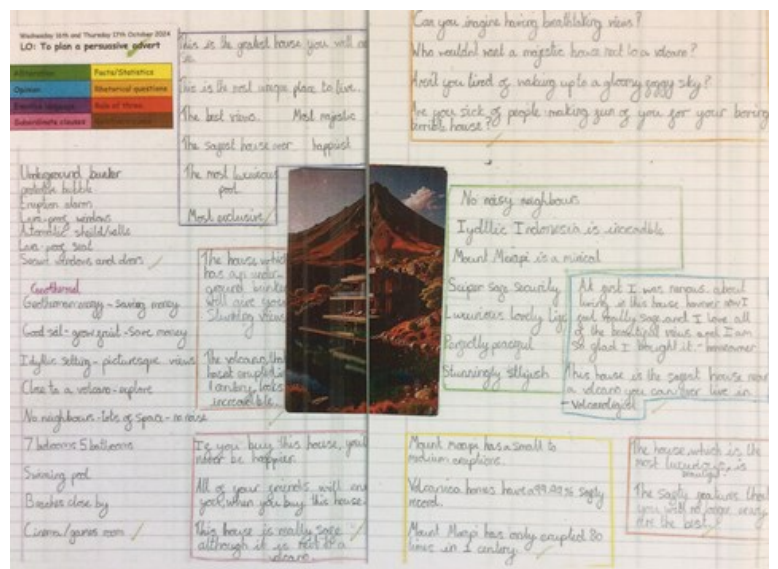
From **Monday 21st October**, the children from Y3-Y6 will have the opportunity to purchase items from the school tuck shop daily.

The staff in Year 5 have been incredibly impressed with their creativity!





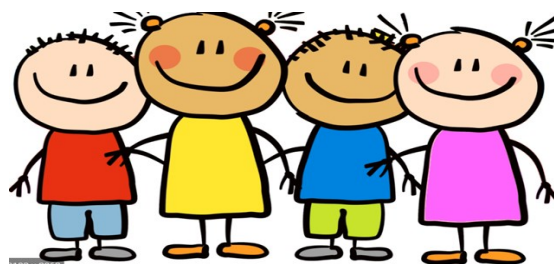

How do I report my child's absence?

Absences should be reported to school via **telephone** (0114 2467396 - option 1 for the attendance team) or using the **ParentMail absence text system** by 9.00am or as soon as practically possible. Telephone lines open daily at 8.00am.

Please do **not** notify school of absences via **Class Dojo** or year group email as these are not constantly monitored.

Formal **Request for Exceptional Leave Forms** must be completed for all planned absences (such as holidays). These are available in the office or can be requested via ParentPay.

98-100%	• Excellent - Children are accessing all learning opportunities
96-97%	• Good - Very few learning opportunities are missed
94-95%	• Risk of underachievement • Up to 10 school days absent in an academic year
92-93%	• High risk of underachievement • Up to 15 school days absent in the academic year
